



# Ethics in Three Parts: Supervision, Research, and Spirituality

Practitioners are recognizing that pursuing an ethical practice is often a multi-faceted and complicated endeavor. This workshop tackles the ethical implications involved in conducting clinical psychology research, providing clinical supervision to trainees, and providing psychotherapy with religious and spiritual individuals. The speaker will emphasize the current best practices in these varying fields. The research portion will include discussions of proper informed consent, confidentiality, and the HIPAA standards. The presentation of supervision will discuss models of training, such as acculturation and competency models. The final portion will provide an overview of the diversity of spiritual and religious perspectives in the psychotherapy process.

Objectives:

- ◆ Participants will be able to report the importance of informed consent and confidentiality to the ethical practice of research in psychology.
- ◆ Participants will be able to identify ethical supervision models and practices.
- ◆ Participants will show understanding into harmful and helpful spiritual beliefs and commitments in psychotherapy.
