WR 100	EFFECTIVE WRITING	Taken in freshman year. WR 101 Empirical Rhetoric may also fulfill this course.
HS 101	HISTORY OF MODERN WESTERN CIVILIZATION	Taken in freshman year.
HS 300	300 LEVEL HISTORY	Prerequisites: WR 100 or WR 101 and HS 101 Offered fall and spring semesters. This course is frequently taken abroad.
EN 101	UNDERSTANDING LITERATURE	Should be taken in freshman or sophomore year. Offered fall and spring semesters. This course is typically taken at Loyola
EN 200 LEVEL	MAJOR WRITERS	Prerequisite: EN 101 Offered fall and spring semesters. This course is frequently taken abroad.
FINE ARTS	SELECT ONE:	AH 111, DR 250, DR 251, MU 201, MU 203, PT 270 or SA 224. This course must be taken at Loyola.
ML 104	INTERMEDIATE LANGUAGE II	The Modern Language Department <i>requires</i> that this course be completed at Loyola.
EC 102†	MICROECONOMIC PRINCIPLES	Typically taken in the fall of freshman year. <i>Required for the BBA.</i> †
EC 103†	MACROECONOMIC PRINCIPLES	Prerequisite: EC 102 Typically taken in the spring of the freshman year. <i>Required for the BBA.</i> †
MA 151 or MA 251†	APPLIED CALC. or CALCULUS I	Offered fall and spring semesters. <i>Required for the BBA. Should be completed prior to junior year.</i> †
NATURAL SCIENCE	BIOLOGY, PHYSICS OR CHEMISTRY	May be a science for non-science majors. A lab is not required.
CS 111 or CS 112 or CS 201	COMPUTER SCIENCE	Offered fall and spring semesters. <i>Required for the BBA and is a prerequisite for IS 251 and should be completed by second semester sophomore year.</i>
PL 201	FOUNDATIONS OF PHILOSOPHY	Offered fall semester only.
PL 200 LEVEL	PHILOSOPHICAL PERSPECTIVES	Offered spring semester only. This may be taken abroad with approval.
TH 201	INTRODUCTION TO THEOLOGY	Offered fall and spring semesters.
TH 202 – TH 280	UPPER LEVEL THEOLOGY	Offered fall and spring semesters. <i>Note: 200 level theology courses beyond 280 do not fulfill the core requirement..</i>
ETHICS	PL 300 – 319 or TH 300 – 319	Prerequisites: PL 201 and one additional PL 200 level course. This course is frequently taken abroad.

BUSINESS CORE – REQUIRED COURSES
ACCOUNTING AND BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION MAJOR
(Class of '10, '11, '12, '13)

AC 201	FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING	FALL/SOPHOMORE Prerequisite: Sophomore standing. Offered fall, spring and summer semesters. This course should be completed prior to junior year.
AC 202 <i>BH 202</i>	MANAGERIAL ACCOUNTING <i>Sellinger Scholars Program</i>	SPRING/SOPHOMORE Prerequisite: AC 201. Offered fall, spring and summer semesters. This course should be completed prior to junior year.
MG 201 <i>BH 201</i>	ORGANIZATIONAL BEHAVIOR <i>Sellinger Scholars Program</i>	Prerequisite: Sophomore standing. Offered fall and spring semesters. This course is not taken abroad.
EC 220	BUSINESS STATISTICS	Prerequisite: MA 151, MA 251 or equivalent. MA 151 or MA 251 may be taken concurrently. Offered fall and spring semesters. This course is not taken abroad. THIS COURSE MUST BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO THE FALL SEMESTER OF THE JUNIOR YEAR.
MK 240	MARKETING	Prerequisite: EC 102 and Sophomore Standing. Offered fall and spring semester. This course is not taken abroad. It is frequently taken abroad.
IS 251 <i>BH 251</i>	INFORMATION SYSTEMS <i>Sellinger Scholars Program</i>	Prerequisite: CS 111 or CS 112 or CS 201. Offered fall and spring semesters. This course is not taken abroad. This course should be completed prior to junior year.
IB 282	INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS	Prerequisite: Sophomore Standing. Offered fall and spring semesters. It is frequently taken abroad. Counts towards Asian Studies minor.
LW 305 <i>BH 305</i>	LEGAL ENVIRONMENT OF BUSINESS <i>Sellinger Scholars Program</i>	Prerequisite: 60 credits. Offered fall and spring semesters. This course is the study of the American system of law and may not be taken abroad.
FI 320	FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT	Prerequisite: EC 102 and AC 201 and sophomore standing. Co-requisites: AC 202 and EC 220. Students concentrating in Finance must complete this course prior to the fall semester of the junior year. Offered fall and spring semesters. It may be taken in the spring of sophomore year concurrently with AC 202.
OM 330	OPERATIONS MANAGEMENT	Prerequisites: IS 251, EC 102, EC 220 and MA 151 or MA 251 or equivalent. Offered fall and spring semesters. In order to help ensure proper course sequencing, it is strongly recommended that students complete this course prior to the senior year. This course has been taken abroad in the past.
MG 402 <i>BH 402</i>	BUSINESS POLICY <i>Sellinger Scholars Program</i>	Prerequisites: MG 201, MK 240, IB 282, LW 305, FI 320, & OM 330, and senior standing in accounting/business administration major. This is the capstone course and must be taken at Loyola College. Offered fall and spring semesters.
EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING REQUIREMENT		Select TWO Options International, Internship and/or Service Experience

Required Courses

MG 415	INTERNATIONAL MANAGEMENT	Prerequisites: EC 102, IB 282 and MG 201. Offered fall and spring semesters.
IB 482	GLOBAL STRATEGY	Prerequisites: IB 282 and MG 415. Offered fall and spring semesters.

REQUIRED: Area Studies Courses: Select One Method

TWO COURSES FOCUSING ON ONE GEOGRAPHIC AREA OUTSIDE THE USA	Each semester the department approves a listing of courses that fulfill this requirement. The topics must be modern or contemporary in nature. Frequently these courses are taken abroad. An example would be: Modern Australian History and Australian National Economics.
TWO COURSES WITH A BROAD INTERNATIONAL FOCUS	Each semester the department approves a listing of courses that fulfill this requirement. An example would be: PS 370 Theories of International Relations and PS 365 International Politics.
TWO COURSES OF A FOREIGN LANGUAGE BEYOND THE INTERMEDIATE LEVEL	Frequently IB students minor in a foreign language. In this case, two of the courses required by the minor fulfill major requirements as well.

International Business Electives: Select Two

FI 340	GLOBAL FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT	FALL & SPRING Prerequisites: FI 320 Co-requisite: IB 282 Note: Closed to students who have taken FI 425.
MK 348	INTERNATIONAL MARKETING: EUROPEAN STUDY TOUR	Prerequisite: MK 240 Note: Restricted to sophomores and juniors. Restricted to accounting and business administration majors and marketing minors. Preference may be given to marketing majors and minors..
LW 410	INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS LAW	SPRING ONLY Prerequisite: LW 305 Note: Fulfills upper-level course requirement and substitutes for an area study course in international business concentration.
IB 429	APPLIED RESEARCH IN MANAGEMENT AND INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS	Prerequisites: Senior Standing, MG 201 and IB 282 Same course as MG 429
EC 446	INTERNATIONAL TRADE	Prerequisites: EC 102 or EC 103 Recommended prerequisite EC 302.
IB 470	SPECIAL TOPICS IN INTERN'L BUSINESS	Prerequisites: IB 282 and 60 credits Note: Topics will vary. May be repeated for credit with different topics.
IB 471	MANAGING DIVERSITY: GLOBALLY AND DOMESTICALLY	Prerequisites: IB 282 and 60 credits.
IB 472	GLOBALIZATION: OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES	Prerequisites: IB 282 and 60 credits.
IB 499	INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS INTERNSHIP	Prerequisites: IB 282 and written permission of the instructor. Note: Only one internship experience may count toward graduation requirements. Occasionally cross-listed with Management Internship (MG 499)..

Special Note: Be especially attentive to courses that “double count,” for instance, PL 216 Asian Thought will fulfill the upper level Philosophy Core requirement as well as the Area Studies requirement of the concentration. A student must have 40 courses to graduate. If one course is double counted (i.e., fulfilling two different requirements) the student actually completes only 39 courses and will not be allowed to graduate. In this circumstance, the proper procedure would be to add a free elective in order to meet the 40 course requirement.

ACCOUNTING AND BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION MAJOR
EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING REQUIREMENT
(Class of '10, '11, 12, '13)

B.B.A. candidates must complete an Experiential Learning Requirement. Select an option from TWO of the following: International, Internship, or Service Experience.

Study Abroad Program

Loyola College Programs, Exchange Programs, Affiliations, Non-Loyola College Programs, Study Tours

Three-Credit Course

Academic course offered with a study tour component coordinated through a faculty member.

Residence Abroad

A U.S. citizen who has lived abroad two or more years after the 12th birthday. Appropriate documentation and formal approval required.

Non-U.S. Citizen

An international student who has matriculated into Loyola College as a degree candidate. Appropriate documentation and formal approval required.

INTERNSHIP EXPERIENCE

Three-Credit Course

A major or elective course, ordinarily taught by a Loyola College faculty member, requiring a minimum of 150 hours working with an organization.

One-Credit Course

Ordinarily taught by the Sellinger School Coordinator for Experiential Learning, requiring a minimum of 100 hours working with an organization. Typically relates to a summer internship or an experience during the traditional semester which is not associated with a three-credit internship course.

Research

A major or elective three-credit course involving collaboration with a faculty member in a significant research endeavor.

SERVICE EXPERIENCE

Three-Credit Service-Learning Course

A major, core or elective course, ordinarily taught by a Loyola College faculty member. A listing of service-learning courses may be found on the Office of Service-Learning website <http://www.loyola.edu/service-learning>.

Three-Credit Course with Service Components

A major, core or elective course, ordinarily taught by a Loyola College faculty member, which includes the option to complete a service project and concludes with a significant and critical reflection paper. The project must be integrated into the academic coursework and requires a minimum of 20 hours of service.

Non-Credit Option

Completion of 56 hours of community service certified by the faculty or on-site supervisor. Options include:

- A major Loyola College service project, through the Center for Community Service and Justice, such as Spring Break Outreach or Project Mexico
- Co-curricular community service activities sponsored by Loyola clubs or honor societies and under the supervision of the faculty advisor.
- Individual community service that is supervised by a faculty member or individual within the sponsoring community organization.

Note: All courses taken abroad are subject to the approval of the department responsible for staffing the course.
