College students also play an important role as they are trained as our youth facilitators and can mentor younger people through our programs. We are facilitating a civic engagement curriculum in the urban middle schools, Operation AWARE that involves hundreds of young people each year in a strategic look at their communities. The 14-week curriculum is co-facilitated by one of our trained AmeriCorps/VISTA's and a classroom teacher. Students learn about civic vs personal responsibility, research and write about social issues affecting them, take part in an out-of-school community asset mapping and design service learning projects. After this program students are eligible to join after-school
