PROGRAM FEE: \$ 3,850 (airfare not included) Program fee includes: tuition for one course, room and board (3 meals per day, cleaning, changing of sheets and towels once a week), group excursions and activities, airport transfers and on-site group transportation.

COURSES (take one of the following):

- 1) SN 300 Literature (Representaciones de España en la Literatura de Viajes Americana e Inglesa), 3 credits
- 2) ML 300 and EN\*2 upper level core requirement (Representations of Spain in Anglo-American Travel Writings), 3 credits

PRE-REQUISITES: EN101 (Understanding Literature) or proof of direct placement in SN201 and SN203 OR SN217.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS: ✓ Cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher.

DEADLINE TO APPLY: February 1, 2021.
