An exploration of the rich past and present of Paris examining how a major city tries to create a more inclusive sense of place while facing some key racism, equity and social justice issues.

- Required 2 online Pre-course orientation meetings
- Course includes **Eleven-day trip to Paris, France, May 24- June 5, 2021**, plus on-line follow up sessions until June 11, 2021,
- Cost: tuition and Paris trip (including breakfast every day, one free weekend, lunch during the week, lodging (11 nights), subway, activities and visits included
- **Three-credit course** fulfills requirements for Area Studies (International Business), Global Studies, Modern Languages Majors and Minors, Modern Language ML course requirements, Diversity requirement
- **This course is entirely taught in English. No language component—prior French not required.**
- Minimum required GPA 2.5.
- **Applications and \$500 deposit due (reimbursed if program has to be cancelled by Loyola (see * below))- first come first served until February 5, 2021.**
- **minimum enrollment: 10 participants**
- **Cost: \$3,850 (without airfare)**
