

ROOM SELECTION PROCESS

This guide was created to highlight important information regarding the room selection process. To be eligible to participate in room selection, students must complete several requirements.

ALL STUDENTS MUST COMPLETE PHASE ONE OF THE APPLICATION

A QUICK OVERVIEW

PHASE ONE: PERSONAL INFORMATION

During this phase, you will submit all your personal information for the housing application.

PHASE TWO: GROUP FORMATION

During this phase, you will have the opportunity to create roommate groups. As a reminder, students must be in complete groups of 2, 4, 6, or 8 to choose a specific housing assignment.

PHASE THREE: ROOM SELECTION

During this phase, students in complete groups (i.e., fill an entire apartment/suite (unit)) will be given a lottery number and, based on space availability, will be able to choose their specific unit.


Phase One Instructions


All students not graduating in May must complete Phase One of the housing application. Please do so to avoid a registration hold and prevent you from registering for classes for the Fall semester.

START YOUR APPLICATION

To start your housing application for the 2023-2024 academic year:

- 1. Log into Inside.Loyola.edu.
- 2. Click RoomRez under Around Campus.
- 3. Navigate to the RoomRez portal.
- 4. Click Applications on the navigation bar on the home page.
- 5. Click "Apply for the 2023-2024 Academic Year".






UPDATE PERSONAL INFORMATION

The following three screens will ask you to verify and update your personal information, emergency contact, and missing person contact. Please follow the instructions on each page if you need to update that information.

Personal Information



According to the Higher Education Act of 2008, Loyola University Maryland is required to collect contact information for an individual who we would contact in the case that you are missing. RESIDENTIAL INTENT

<u>All students</u> are required to declare their residential intent. Depending on your answer, you will be directed to the appropriate page. **Remember, this is for the FALL semester**, not the entire academic year.

All Loyola University Maryland students are required to complete this form to inform the university of their living arranagements for the following academic year. By completing this form, we understand what kind of communication we need to send you in the future.

PAY DEPOSIT

All students must pay their housing deposit in the RoomRez portal before continuing through the housing application. Students with waived deposits will bypass the deposit pages and be directed to the next page. If you have a question about your housing deposit or have concerns about payment, please don't hesitate to contact Student Administrative Services at SAS@loyola.edu. PLEASE NOTE: students must make their deposit payment via credit card and cannot have another person make it on their behalf.

What is the housing deposit?

The housing deposit is a \$300 non-refundable payment to secure your housing spot for the upcoming academic year. You will be permitted to join a roommate group once the deposit is paid or you have spoken to SAS.

Step 1: Read the deposit instruction page.

Payment Details: Tuition and Housing Deposit

This deposit page is intended for Loyola students who are studying on the Evergreen campus and living on campus in the Fall semester.

Please note that the Housing portion of the deposit is non-refundable.

All students will be required to make their tuition deposit via credit card utilizing the RoomRez portal. Students concerned about making this deposit or currently experience financial hardship should contact Student Administrative Services (SAS) prior to continuing through this housing application.

All full-time students planning to take classes on the Baltimore Campus in the Fall 2020 semester are required to pay a \$300 Tuition Deposit. Any student currently living in the residence halls or those returning from one of Loyola's abroad, exchange, or affiliation programs who wish to participate in the upcoming housing selection process are required to pay an additional \$300 Housing Deposit. If there is currently a financial hold on your account, you will not be eligible to register for classes or housing. Any deposit made will be applied to the outstanding bill. Past due statements will be mailed the week of February 4, 2020.

Academic registration for Fall 2020 will take place between March 18 through April 1, 2020 and is based on the student's class year. Students will be allowed to register at the designated time determined by seniority and lottery if they have paid their tuition deposit. Full-time students who have not paid the deposit by the February 13, 2020 deadline will be required to submit the tuition deposit along with a \$100 late registration fee. The timing of a delayed tuition deposit can result in a loss of seniority in the registration process.

SAVE & CONTINUE

Step 2: Review the payment page and click "Pay Now." This will redirect you to our payment site.

Step 3: Fill out your credit card information and click Pay Now.

Step 4: Review and print your receipt. Click "Continue" to return to the application.

Step 5: Click "Ok" to return to the application.

You will receive an automatic email from StudentLife@loyola.edu. Please note this is a confirmation email, not a formal receipt.

If the payment is unsuccessful, you will be taken to the first page of the deposit process and not permitted to continue.

FAQ ON HOUSING DEPOSIT

What if the deposit page says I need to pay more than I thought I should?

Students are taken to a deposit page based on the information Student Life has on file. If you think your deposit page is incorrect, please contact Student Life before paying your deposit.

How can I give my family access to make the deposit?

Deposits are only being accepted through the RoomRez portal via credit card. Students must coordinate with their families to get payment information before starting their application. Families will not have access to make payments on their student's behalf.

What If I cannot afford to pay the deposit?

Students with concerns about payment should contact Student Administrative Services in Maryland Hall or SAS@Loyola.edu before starting the housing application.

Is the housing deposit refundable?

The housing deposit is non-refundable. You can visit the housing contract to learn more about the housing refund policy.

Is there a credit card transaction fee?

No. You will only be charged the amount of the deposit due.

What credit cards can I use to pay my online housing deposit? You can use Visa, AMEX, Master Card, and Discover.

Can I use any other forms of payment to pay my deposit?

At this time, we can only accept credit payments online. If you have specific questions, please contact Student Administrative Services at sas@loyola.edu.

Should I pay the deposit if I am considering transferring?

Students can only be added to roommate groups or placed in housing once the housing deposit is paid. If you are considering transferring, please get in touch with Student Life to discuss options.

What if I can make the payment after the deadline?

Student Life will continue to accept housing deposits. Students who pay their deposit after the phase 2 deadline will not be able to join a group or participate in phase 3- room selection. Students will be placed in housing based on space availability after phase 3 concludes.

What happens If I do not pay the deposit?

Students will not continue through the housing application until payment has been made or you have spoken with SAS. This means you cannot be added to a roommate group or be placed in housing or register for classes.

How long does it take for the academic hold to be removed?

Students who fail to complete phase 1 by the deadline will have an academic hold placed on their account, preventing them from registering for classes. This hold is removed manually and may take 2 business days from phase 1 completion.

If i decide not to live on campus, can I get my housing deposit back?

The housing deposit is non-refundable. Please review the Housing Contract Cancellation terms in the Housing contract regarding the cancellation process.

SIGN AND SUBMIT HOUSING CONTRACT


Before continuing through the application, all students must sign and agree to the housing contract terms and conditions. Information about canceling your contract can be found on page: 56.

- Step 3: Choose to Start my Grad Guard Enrollment or Decline All Coverage.
- Step 4: Answer the Grad Guard questions.
- Step 5: Click "Continue" to resume the housing application.

You will be given a "Decline" or "Success" message depending on your response. Click "Save and Continue."



CHOOSE MEAL PLAN

All residents are required to participate in the University meal plan program. To learn more about the meal plans, visit www.loyola.edu/dining or visit page 49. When choosing your meal plan, you will only be shown the meal plans you are eligible for.

You will choose your meal plan for both the Fall and Spring semesters. Students can change their meal plan for the Spring towards the end of the Fall semester.

SUBSTANCE FREE HOUSING

Our Substance Free Community offers a space for those students who genuinely desire to live in an environment where all residents and their guests agree to keep the area free of alcohol, drugs, and nicotine products. Residents agree to create an environment where they respect one another and have healthy lifestyles.

Just so you know, to create roommate groups and search for roommates, everyone must have the same answer to this question and sign the substance-free agreement.

Substance Free Housing is in Seton Court, and **students** requesting to live in Substance Free housing will not participate in Phase 3 (room selection). The Office of Student Life will assign you and your roommate group to housing, and depending on your roommate group size, other students may be added to your group to fill an apartment.

GLOBAL CONNECTIONS HOUSING

This housing option is available to rising sophomores, juniors, and seniors in groups of 3 or 5 interested in living with an international exchange student for the 2023-2024 academic year. It is a great way to expand your knowledge of the world while sharing your culture with a new member of our Loyola community.

To be considered, all interested roommate groups should complete the application below as part of Phase 1. All roommates must agree to participate in the program and answer the questions. If a member of your roommate group selects "No," your group will not be accepted. Once accepted, roommate groups of 3 or 5 residents will be considered "Complete." They will proceed with the standard housing process (receiving a lottery time and selecting any room available during their room selection time.) A Student Life staff member will reach out to you if your group isn't selected.

All students must select "Yes" or "No" to continue with the application.

Phase Two Instructions

All students must be in a complete roommate group.

GROUP FORMATION INFORMATION

All students must complete Phase Two by being a member of a "complete group." To select a specific unit, you must be part of a complete group of 2, 4, 6, or 8 that fills all beds in that entire unit. In other words, the number of students in a group must match the number of available beds in the unit you are attempting to select.

GROUP MEMBER ROLES

The Group Leader

Something simple, appropriate, and easy to remember. Please remember that Student Life will see your group name.

Add everyone to the group:

Add group members by searching for each student. Students already assigned to a room or in another group cannot be added to your group.

Verify the group:

If this is not done, you will not be able to select as a group.

Select beds for the group:

During the group leader's time slot, they will select the beds and rooms for each group member. Groups must fill all the beds in the unit.

Group Members

Verify your membership:

Ensure you have been added to a group by logging into your housing application and checking your membership. You can add yourself to a group by searching for the group name and entering the password. You cannot be in more than one group at a time.

Confirm your assignment:

Once the Group Leader has reserved your room, log into your application to view your assignment.





PHASE TWO: COMPLETE

Once you land on the "Room Selection Hold page," you have completed Phase Two. Every student should be a member of a complete roommate group. Only the group leader can access the "Room Selection pages" of Phase Three. All other students will be taken to a booking summary page.

REMINDERS

- Only verified groups can select together. Every time someone joins or leaves the group, it must be re-verified.
- Only students who complete Phase One of their housing application may be added to your group. Students who have not paid their housing deposit or signed their housing contract will not show in the search or have access to join a group.
- Students who said "Yes" to Substance Free Housing can only be added to groups where everyone else selected "Yes."
- Students may join a group with any returning student of any class who can live on campus.
- You must be in a group of 2, 4, 6, or 8 to choose a specific unit.
- You will receive email updates as your group changes.
- If your group leader needs to be changed due to a conflict and is unavailable to select housing at their lottery time, please contact Student Life.

Phase Three Instructions

Only the roommate group leader can assign your group to housing.

ROOM SELECTION IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Rising sophomores, juniors, and seniors may only select on the day of their time slot. When you log back into your housing application, you should be taken directly to the "Room Selection" pages. You will be taken to a holding page if you log in before your assigned time.
- Only the group leader can log in to choose your unit.
- Group members who log in will be taken to a "Booking Summary" page and will not access the "Room Selection" pages.
- The group leader has 15 minutes from their assigned time to select a room.
- Please keep in mind that every 15 minutes, a new group of students will have access to the room selection portal. It is to your advantage to choose your unit and confirm your assignment as quickly as possible.
- If you select a room but want to continue looking for additional options, your original room will be held for you while searching for a new space. However, you can only keep one unit at a time.
- If any person in your group cancels or changes their application, the entire group will be affected.
- You will need to choose all bedrooms associated with that unit.


CHOOSE YOUR UNIT

The room selection portal will show available spaces at your selection time; however, you can only select a unit that matches your roommate group size.


Step 1: Choose a building. This page will show only buildings with units that match the size of your roommate group. Once you select a building, you can search for other buildings on the next page.

ASSIGN BEDS


Once you add a room to your cart, you will be asked to assign each member of your roommate group to bed space.

Step 1: Click the "Select Bed" drop-down menu and assign the specific bed space you want someone to occupy.

Step 2: Select the next roommate from the drop-down menu and assign them a bed space.

Step 3: Continue until everyone is assigned a bed space.


Step 4: Click Assign Beds.



CONFIRM BEDS

On this page, you will confirm that this is the bed space you (and your group) want to reserve for the next academic year. You will not be able to adjust your room once you click "Save and Continue."

This is your final opportunity to click the back button and change your selection. If you are satisfied with your choices, click "Save and Continue". Everyone in your group will receive a confirmation email of their assignment.



This is the final step of the Housing Selection application; it is a recap of your application. Once you click "Confirm and Finish," your application is officially complete.





Roommate Group Search




Search for Roommate Group allows you to search based on group size or groups with specific people.

SEARCH FOR ROOMMATES BY DETAILS


Roommate Search By Details

Roommate Search By Profiles




Search for Roommates by Profile allows you to search for a roommate based on answers to the Roommate Questionnaire. Please note that the more questions you select, the harder it will be to find compatible roommates. We suggest answering 1-2 questions most important to you. You also may see questions not relevant to you; leave them with "any."

SUGGEST ROOMMATES

Current Commuters Considering Living Off Campus

Want to live closer to campus? Student Life is excited to welcome commuters or off-campus students who wish to become residents! Any student wishing to live on campus with their friends may go through the same housing selection process as current residents.

LIVING OFF CAMPUS

All students are required to complete Phase 1 of the application. If you plan to live off-campus, you will be required to:

- Confirm your personal information
- Update your Emergency Contact Information
- Update your Missing Person Contact
- Complete your Intent To Live on Campus
- Pay your \$300 tuition deposit
- Complete the Living Off-Campus page

REGISTER YOUR ADDRESS

Undergraduate students planning to live off-campus must register their local address before starting classes. The address collection process takes place over the summer, and all students without oncampus housing will receive information via email regarding this process.

OFF CAMPUS CONDUCT POLICIES

The Community Standards still apply to students when not on Loyola's campus. Further, Loyola has a specific set of standards for off-campus students. Information about off-campus policies and expectations can be found in the off-campus policies section in the Community Standards.

THINKING ABOUT LIVING OFF CAMPUS?

In many cases, living on campus in a residence hall is more affordable than living off-campus in an apartment or rental home. The cost of living on campus includes utilities such as electricity, gas, water, air conditioning, heating, Wi-Fi, and cable. You will have to pay for these in addition to your rent in most houses and apartments. Most homes and some apartments don't come furnished; that's another expense. Living on campus also means you don't need a car and, therefore, won't incur gas and parking expenses. Plus, living on campus allows you to walk to your classes in minutes. Most importantly, University housing provides 24/7 security, while many off-campus options do not.

HOW DOES LIVING OFF CAMPUS AFFECT FINANCIAL AID?

Your award considers whether you will be living on-campus or commuting based on the information provided to Student Life and your FAFSA. Your award indicates your housing status; if your housing plans change, you must notify Financial Aid at financialaid@loyola.edu, as it may impact your aid.

OFF CAMPUS POLICIES & GUIDELINES

There are <u>policies</u>, <u>guidelines</u>, <u>and expectations</u>, including the Neighborhood Agreement and Community Standards, that shape your off-campus experience. Loyola has an agreement with the North Baltimore Neighborhood Coalition, which includes neighborhoods contiguous to the Evergreen campus. It states we will restrict our students from living and parking in those neighborhoods. Visit the Off-Campus Conduct page to learn more.

THINGS TO CONSIDER WHEN LIVING OFF CAMPUS

- You may feel disconnected from campus life. You likely will have fewer friends residing around the corner or down the hall and need to plan more intentionally to attend and participate in campus events.
- You need to research the property management company and surrounding area.
- Apartment complexes may not be as flexible as the university regarding payment and working with student loan options.
- You need to build time for travel and find parking when planning your day.
- You have to stay more conscious of gas and electric usage; you will pay these utilities monthly.

The Housing Contract

The housing contract is a legally binding agreement between the student and the University. It is essential that you read and understand its contents BEFORE you agree to it.

TOP TEN THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT THE HOUSING CONTRACT

- You agree to live in housing for the entire Academic Year (August-May).
- Students also agree to the Loyola University Community Standards by agreeing to the housing contract.
- 2 If your housing needs to change, you must request to cancel before June 1 to avoid penalties.
- 8
- The University reserves the right to select the specific bedroom and building to be assigned to a student, assign other occupants to the unit, and move a student to another bedroom or unit at any time, at the University's sole and absolute discretion.
- You must be registered for at least 12 credits by the start of the semester to move in and no later than the end of Add/Drop to remain in campus housing.
- 4 Students requesting accommodations for a disability must do so by February 1 after the deadline; accommodations will be provided based on space availability.
- Students who need to remain on campus during University break periods must agree to complete a housing break extension request. Additional fees may apply.
- All students are required to have a meal plan.
- A copy of the housing contract is available on the Student Life website and downloaded from the housing application.
- The housing contract goes into effect once it is signed.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The Terms and Conditions of the Housing Contract occur after students submit their signed contract. Once signed, students enter into a legally binding agreement for the entire academic year. We highly suggest that students and their families read the terms and conditions to understand our expectations fully. Copies of the contract are available for download in the housing application or on the Student Life website.

CANCELLATION DATES

If you need to cancel your housing, please submit a request to Student Life using the "Release from Housing Contract Request" form on the Student Life website under forms. Be aware that submitting a request is not automatic approval. You will be notified via email once a decision is made. Loyola University highly recommends that you not sign an off-campus lease until you are officially notified of a decision.

Suppose a contract Cancellation Request is **received by June 1 and approved**, the advance payment and damage deposit will be credited to the Student's account. In that case, no cancellation fee will be assessed, and any housing room charges billed under this contract will be refunded.

Suppose a contract Cancellation Request is **received between June**1 and August 1 and approved, the advance payment and damage deposit will be forfeited. In that case, no cancellation fee will be assessed, and any other housing room charges billed under the contract be refunded.

Suppose a Contract Cancellation Request is **received after August 1** and approved, the advance payment and the damage deposit will be forfeited. In that case, a \$300 cancellation fee will be assessed, and any other housing room charges billed under this contract be refunded.

HOUSING SELECTION FAQ

How are the housing selection days assigned?

Housing selection days are determined by looking at all group members' current reunion years. You will be assigned the selection day of the highest class year in your group. If you believe you were given the wrong selection day, please contact Student Life as soon as you receive your date and time.

If I am returning from a Leave of Absence where do I fall in the housing process?

Students on a leave of absence but plan to return to Loyola for the Fall may participate in the housing selection process. If you do not participate in room selection, please contact Student Life once you are cleared to return to discuss next steps.

Should I go through housing selection if I am applying to be a Resident Assistant?

Yes! All students are required to complete Phase One of the housing application. Those hired for the upcoming academic year will be given instructions on completing your application. Employment decision letters should be available before Phase Two.

What if I want to change my housing assignment after I have already been assigned?

If you have concerns about your housing assignment, please don't hesitate to contact Student Life.

What if a vacancy becomes available in my unit after selection?

Student Life will use the Roommate Questionnaire to place a compatible roommate in the vacancy. If you have questions about your vacancy, please contact Student Life.

What if I am a current resident and want to live with an incoming freshman or transfer?

Returning students are unable to live with incoming first-year students. If you are interested in living with an incoming transfer, please contact Student Life to discuss possibilities. The incoming transfer must have applied to Loyola before the Phase 2 deadline.

HOUSING SELECTION FAQ

Can I preference a single room?

Loyola only provides singles to those with approved accommodations. There are limited units with three bedrooms, where one may be a single. Those are available during the room selection and cannot be reserved in advance.

What if I am the group leader and unavailable during my lottery time?

Only one person in your group is needed to select your specific housing. You can change your group leader by contacting Student Life.

How does housing selection work if I am currently abroad?

Students currently studying abroad will complete the same process as students currently at Loyola. Because the process is completed electronically, you can access all forms. Please pay attention to deadlines as they are for local time in Baltimore.

What if I am unsure if I want to live on campus next year?

Please contact Student Life to discuss possible options. Students are encouraged not to sign the housing contract if they are not 100% committed to living on campus. Students can complete phase 1 as living off-campus and then later request on-campus; students will be assigned housing based on availability.

What if I am studying abroad next Spring semester?

Students studying on the Evergreen campus for the entire academic year or Fall semester must participate in this process. If you are confirmed studying abroad in the Spring semester, Student Life will cancel your spring housing assignment with no penalties.

What if the friend I want to live with is abroad in the Fall?

Student Life cannot hold any bed spaces for students not studying on the Evergreen campus during the Fall semester. We recommend including someone in your roommate group planning to study abroad in the Spring. This way, the two students can switch for the Spring semester.
