Moratorium on Hydraulic Fracturing "Fracking" in Maryland

Both the Maryland Senate and House of Delegates overwhelmingly supported an extended ban that prohibits hydraulic fracturing or "fracking" in the state in order to further investigate the risks of the natural gas extraction technique to both public health and the environment.
